Beginner-friendly checklist for new RV owners learning the basics.

Before You Start

- Read your RV owner's manual for model-specific instructions
- Locate main water shut-off valve (emergency shutoff)
- Find electrical breaker panel location and label
- Identify propane tank shut-off valves and emergency procedures
- Locate fire extinguisher and learn how to use it
- Take photos of all utility connections for future reference

Step-by-Step First Setup

- Park and level your RV FIRST (most important step)
- Connect utilities ONE at a time (electric, water, sewer)
- Test each connection before moving to the next
- Turn on systems gradually and verify operation
- Ask campground staff for help - they're usually happy to assist
- Keep detailed setup notes for your next trip

Essential Beginner Safety Tips

- ALWAYS use surge protector for electrical (protect expensive electronics)
- Never drink from RV fresh water tank without sanitizing first
- Test propane connections with soapy water (bubbles = leak)
- Keep basic tool kit accessible (screwdrivers, wrench set, duct tape)

- Learn your RV's weight and height limits before travel
- Practice setup procedures at home before first camping trip

New RVer Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Don't overload electrical circuits (hair dryer + microwave = breaker trip)
- Never leave slide-outs extended in high wind
- Don't fill fresh water tank completely if traveling (weight)
- Always chock wheels even if ground looks level
- Don't run generator during campground quiet hours
- Never assume all campground pedestals work properly
